RESPOND TO THE 2020 CENSUS TO SHAPE THE FUTURE

Data collection begins March 2020 and continues through August 2020. You will receive a letter with instructions for completing the census beginning in March 2020. Data from the census helps communities get the funding they need for services and infrastructure in your community. This includes health care, senior centers, jobs, political representation, roads, schools and businesses.

THE 2020 CENSUS IS CONFIDENTIAL

Your responses to the 2020 census are safe, secure and protected by federal law. Your answers can only be used to produce statistics — *they cannot be used against you in any way.*

How can I respond to the census?

The Census Bureau will offer the census form in four ways:

1. Online, using the internet or a smartphone,
2. Over the telephone, by calling the Census call center listed on the Census letter,
3. Using a paper form, or
4. By responding to a census worker at your door.
